

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Panchakarma is a process of cleansing and rejuvenating the system based on the ancient system of Ayurveda. It works with the subtle flow of energy, incorporating various bodywork techniques to allow healing at the deepest level. Using natural ingredients, it is customized for individuals based on their constitution and health conditions. This course covers Panchakarma's philosophy, principles and methods of implementation, as outlined in the Vedic texts. Upon successful completion of the course, you will be awarded a Panchakarma Technician Certificate.

# **PREREQUISITES**

- Students must submit proof of a high school diploma or equivalent.

# Scope of Practice

Upon completion, Panchakarma Technicians are able to:

- Perform all Ayurvedic hands-on Shamana therapies in a clinic or private practice with an emphasis on utilizing the techniques for purposes of pacification. Shamana includes external calming procedures & regimen without internal cleansing.
- Perform Panchakarma therapies in connection with a Panchakarma program, under the guidance of a qualified Ayurvedic Practitioner/Vaidya, with an emphasis on utilizing the therapies for purposes of Shamana and Shodhana Chikitsa. Shodhana includes detoxification & purification procedures and requires the advanced clinical knowledge of an Ayurvedic Vaidya.
- Support and help deliver the Panchakarma treatment program designed by the Ayurvedic Practitioner/Vaidya. The Panchakarma Technician is not trained to design a complete Panchakarma program with both Shamana and Shodhana therapies.

The individual's scope of practice will be more specifically designated by local/state guidelines. It is the individual's responsibility to be compliant.

# LEARNING OUTCOMES

This course is designed to provide comprehensive education in the traditional Panchakarma methodologies as outlined in the Vedic texts in a contemporary context for today's health seekers and professionals. Upon completion, students will:

- Understand the ancient Ayurvedic theory of the elements, individual constitution, subtle energetics and how to apply them in a healing context.
- Be able to assess the Ayurvedic constitution and imbalance of a client, communicate and document the findings with an Ayurvedic Practitioner/Vaidya.
- Discover the step-by-step process of cleansing and rejuvenation for all body systems, including the three phases of Panchakarma and the five-fold detoxification process.
- Learn how to design a customized plan for simple Panchakarma Shamana (external therapies) for an individual.
- Learn how to implement a customized plan for Shamana (external therapies) and Shodhana (internal cleansing therapies) with the support of an Ayurvedic Practitioner/Vaidya.
- Learn how to create specialized, client-customized oils with natural herbal ingredients for therapies.
- Learn how to prepare specialized food during Panchakarma.
- Understand the purpose, function, indications, contraindications, and how to perform bodywork treatments including Abhyanga, Udvartana, Svedana, Pinda Sveda, Pizhichil, Dhara, Shirodhara, Takradhara, Ksheera Dhara, Kati Vasti, Valuka Sweda, Nasya, Netra Tarpana, Upanaha, Pichu, Choorna Sweda, Marma Balancing.
- Guide clients on the post-Panchakarma food and lifestyle practices to maintain health.



# Curriculum

#### PK001 | Foundational Principles of Ayurveda

We begin studying the roots of Ayurveda and how this "common sense science" system can help heal and maintain balance for life. Learn how the three universal energies and the five elements are important in maintaining health and longevity, as well as the fundamental tenets of an effective Ayurvedic health program. Topics include:

- History and philosophy of Ayurveda.
- The three universal energies (Doshas) and five elements (Mahabhutas).
- Physiological disposition (Prakruti), imbalances (Vikruti) and dynamic balance.
- An Ayurvedic view of the universe and humanity's place within it.
- A comprehensive introduction to basic Ayurvedic concepts: Agni, Doshas, Dhatus, Malas, Srotas and Marmas.
- Principles of Ayurvedic psychology.
- Principles of Ayurvedic nutrition.
- Concept of detoxification and rejuvenation.

### PK002 | Principles of Panchakarma

Next, we will deepen our learning on detoxification and rejuvenation by studying the ethics, reasons, methods and treatments during Panchakarma from beginning to end. Topics include:

- Principles of Panchakarma and how it works.
- Benefits of Panchakarma.
- Indications and Contraindications.
- Process of Panchakarma:
  - · Preparatory phase.

- Main process of purification.
- Post purification recuperation.
- Preparation for Panchakarma:
  - Deepana and Pachana.
  - Snehana and Swedana.
- The main purification processes.
- Concept of Marma therapy.

#### PK003 | Advanced Principles and Practice of Panchakarma

The final module in the theoretical series involves a combination of theory and hands-on practice, covering advanced topics of Panchakarma, including bodywork, detoxification and *Rasayana*. Topics include:

- Review of the Panchakarma process will be covered, including the *Poorvakarma* (Preparation),
   Pradhanakarma (Main Procedure) and *Paschatkarma* (Post panchakarma recuperation).
- The preparatory procedures, including various types of *Snehana* & *Swedana* therapies such as *Abhyanga, Choornasweda, Patrapotala Sweda, Njavarakizhi, Kateevasthi, Shirodhara, Lepam, Pichu*.
- The five-fold Ayurvedic detoxification procedures such as Vamana, Virechana, Anuvasana, Niroohavasthi and Nasya.
- The post-Panchakarma recuperation, including specific food and lifestyle modification.
- Rasayana: Rejuvenation modalities of Ayurveda.

#### Practical Session 1 | Prep and Purvakarma

The first class of the practical series will introduce you to the hands-on knowledge and experience you will need to be a successful Panchakarma Technician, beginning with some of the preliminary Panchakarma therapies known as *Purvakarama*, including *Swedana*. Topics include:

- Guidelines for the client's diet and lifestyle during Panchakarma.
- Indications, contraindications, safety and precautions for the technician.

  - Shiro Abhyanga (Oil application on head).

- Mukha Abhyanga (Oil application on face).
- Pada Abhyanga (Oil application on feet).
- Deha Abhyanga (Oil application on body).
- Specialty Abhyanga:
  - Garbhini Abhyanga (Prenatal oleation).
  - Sutika Abhyanga (Postnatal oleation).

    - Jambira Pinda Sweda (Lemon bolus).
    - Shashtika Pinda Sweda (Rice bolus).
  - Snehana & Swedana (Oil & Heat):
    - Choorna Pinda Swedam (Powder bolus with oil).
    - Kayaseka (Pizhichil The Royal Oil bath).

# Practical Session 2 | Main Panchakarma Techniques and Specialty Therapies

This session will introduce the application of Shamana therapies. We'll discuss a variety of case studies and evaluate and make recommendations.

The Shamana therapies include:

- Thakradhara (Shirodhara with herbalised buttermilk).
- Ksheeradhara (Shirodhara with herbalised milk).
- Kati Vasti (Warm oil retained on lower back).
- Greeva Vasti (Warm oil retained on neck).
- Janu Vasti (Warm oil retained on knee).

Main Panchakarma techniques and specialty therapies which will be specifically conducted under the guidance of an Ayurvedic Doctor (*Vaidya*):

- Pradhana Karma (Main procedures):
  - Vamana (Induced emesis theoretical understanding only).
  - Virechana (Medicated purgation).

- Vasti (Medicated Enemas):
  - Sneha Vasti (Preparation and practice)
  - Kashaya Vasti (Preparation and variations based on conditions).
- Nasya (Nasal administration).
- Raktamoksha (Bloodletting theoretical understanding only).
- Specialty Shamana Therapies:
  - Netra Kalpanas (Eye therapies):
    - Netra Sekam
    - Aschyotanam
    - Netra Pindi
    - Vidalakam
    - Netra Tarpanam or Netra Vasti
    - Putapakam
    - Anjanam
  - Shirovasti
  - Shirolepam
  - Ksheera Dhoomam
- Paschatkarma (Post-Panchakarma recuperation).
- Rasayana selection, dosage and methods of application.

# FORMAT:

# Elearning

The Pre-recorded lectures for PK001, PK002 and PK003 are available in the elearning system where students may watch recorded lectures at their own pace. There are also supplemental recordings, pretests and tests after each of these events. The tests are graded pass/fail and students can retake them up to 3 times.

### Assignment: Hands-on Practice

This assignment will provide students with hands-on practice outside of class. It is designed to allow students to apply their learning in hands-on experience to build as a technician. Students are responsible to complete their practical hours and perform any of the techniques they have learned for ten sessions. The assignment is submitted in a written case summary format for evaluation by the assigned mentor. Students have the opportunity to interact with their mentor to discuss and improve on any issues or concerns which may arise during the clinical encounters via the elearning system or during the Q&A Sessions.

### Creating Panchakarma Protocol: 5 Cases

Students are provided with five (5) cases with detailed client information. The student will research, create and document a customized Panchakarma protocol including:

- Deepana and Pachana protocol.
- Snehana protocol.
- Swedana protocol.
- Shodhana process.
- Diet and lifestyle recommendations during and after the Panchakarma therapies.
- Rasayana protocol.

### **TESTS & GRADING**

- There are three tests on the material taught.
- Tests are multiple choice. Minimum passing grade is 70%.
- All testing is conducted online through our elearning system and grades are immediately available in the student online account. Project and assignment grades are posted within 10 days of submission.
- A student who does not achieve the minimum passing grade of 70% for graduation may retake the tests up to three times. The highest score will be recorded.

# **COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS**

- The student paid the full tuition for the program.
- The student watched Recorded Lectures of PK001, PK002 and PK003.
- The student attended in person the two 5-day practicums.
- The student passed all tests with a minimum grade of 70%.

### FINANCIAL AID

# STUDENT TUITION RECOVERY FUND (STRF) FEE (NON-REFUNDABLE) – STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is a California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition.

You are not eligible for protection from the STRF and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program." "It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss as a result of any of the following:

federal student financial aid program funds.

- The institution, a location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.
- You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120-day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120-day period before the program was discontinued.
- You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.
- The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.
- The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution in excess of tuition and other costs.
- You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.
- You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.

To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF. A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of non-collection may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4) year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law. However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number."

# **DIVERSITY**

### ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance is monitored via attendance taken in-class and during live streamed sessions. The total available hours in this program are 250, including 82 in-class practical session hours which are required attendance for this program.

### MAKE-UP AND RETAKE POLICY

If a student is unable to take the Practical Sessions, they must attend them live to complete the program. This can be accomplished by 1. Retaking with a future class; or 2. # **CONDUCT**

At KAA, programs are directed toward professional training. The students shall show respect to others and observe correct standards of conduct. The Honor System embodies values of personal integrity, honesty, and trust.

Fundamental to the Honor System is the Honor Code of Responsibility, and it is upon its principles that the Academy has based the Standards of Conduct.

# Honor Code of Responsibility

- Each member is responsible for maintaining a high level of civility, integrity, honesty, and trust within the community.
- Each student is responsible for presenting work of her/his own creation and refraining from representing as her/his own work that is not her/his.
- Conduct in keeping with the attendance policies.

# TERMINATION AND DISMISSAL POLICY

- If the course is terminated after the student begins classes, the Academy may retain a percentage of the total tuition as described in the Refund Policy.
- For a student who is on authorized Sabbatical, the withdrawal date is the date the student was scheduled to return from Leave and failed to do so.
- For nonpayment issues: verbal and written warnings will be sent from Student Support Services. After a minimum of 3 attempts within 3 months and no response from the student, the student will be immediately dismissed.

# SUSPENSION (PROBATION) POLICY

There are disciplinary guidelines to provide an environment to learn and grow independently, which give students rights and responsibilities.

- Any behavior disruptive to other students or the smooth running of the class will not be allowed.
- Students will have to pay the tuition on time; this includes one-time fees and payment plans.
- Students must maintain a passing grade of 70%.

For behavioral issues: At first incidence, warning will be given. At the second incident, the student will be suspended for the entire weekend. A student will be readmitted after a suspended weekend. If the behavior persists, the student will be dismissed (terminated) from the program. When the conduct of the student threatens the other student's safety, KAA reserves the right to dismiss a student immediately.

# LENGTH OF TIME FOR STUDENT CERTIFICATIONS

**PKT** Students are expected to complete within August 26, 2026, however they can take an additional 3 months to complete, if necessary, without penalty.

If after the extended time you do not complete your program, you are considered dropped. You will need to complete a new enrollment agreement and reapply for the program.

# STUDENT SABBATICAL (LEAVE OF ABSENCE)

If a student has completed their full tuition payment or wants to take sabbatical and is paid up to date, they may take a sabbatical up to 1 year and then re-enroll in the next program, transferring their payment credit and attendance to the new class co-hort. (Note: During the sabbatical there is no access to their course materials or their mentor).

If a student does not return from their sabbatical, they will be dropped from the program. If they wish to return after being dropped, they will need to re-enroll in the program as a new student and complete their payment prior to the class start date.

**Procedure:** Students must contact Student Support Services for a Sabbatical Request form and pay a \$50 fee. Once the form has been submitted and approved, the student has up to 1 year from that date for their sabbatical.

# ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE & FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign students are accepted, however, KAA courses are instructed in English and KAA does not offer English as a second language. Foreign students are required to have proof of English proficiency with a passing score of minimum 80% on the TOEFL exam for enrollment. Visa services are not provided, and Kerala Ayurveda Academy will not vouch for student status and any associated charges.

# **RECORD RETENTION**

All records concerning the Kerala Ayurveda Academy are kept for fifty years after a student's graduation, withdrawal or termination, except for transcripts which are kept permanently. # Student Complaint (Grievance) Procedure

Students have the right to submit grievances to resolve disputes concerning issues considered by a student policy. This process is important for ensuring fairness and accountability within educational institutions, as it gives students a mechanism to address concerns and seek resolution when they feel their rights or privileges have been adversely affected. By establishing clear procedures for handling grievances, schools can promote transparency and uphold standards of justice within their community. Here is a breakdown of the steps:

#### Step One: Attempt to Resolve the Grievance through an Informal Grievance Process

Informal Resolution: This step encourages students to address their concerns directly with the faculty, staff, or administrator involved. If this doesn't lead to a satisfactory resolution, they can escalate the issue to the lead or Student Support.

#### Step Two: Submit a Formal Grievance

Formal Grievance: If the informal process does not help to resolve the issue, the student can submit a formal grievance. This must be done in writing, within a specified timeframe mentioned below, and must outline the steps taken during the informal process, the alleged policy violation, the person(s) involved, and the requested resolution.

The formal grievance must:

- Be submitted in writing within thirty calendar days of the decision, action, or events giving rise to the grievance.
- Describe the steps taken to remedy the situation through the informal grievance process.
- State how the decision or action is unfair and harmful to the grievant and list the policy that has been violated, if known.
- Name the person(s) against whom the grievance is filed.
- State the requested resolution.

#### Step Three: Investigation and Resolution

Investigation and Resolution: The designated authority will investigate the grievance and communicate the outcome to the student within a specified timeframe. This step ensures transparency and accountability in resolving the grievance.

#### **Final Appeal of Student Grievance**

Final Appeal: If the student is not satisfied with the resolution provided, they have the option to file a final appeal within 14 days. During this period, any claims or disciplinary actions are placed on hold until the issue has reached resolution and is implemented. The designee will review the appeal and communicate the final decision within a specified timeframe; this decision is considered final. This process ensures a fair and timely resolution to the grievance.

# TRANSFERRING OF CREDITS & CREDENTIALS

"NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS EARNED AT KERALA AYURVEDA ACADEMY. The transferability of credits you earn at Kerala Ayurveda Academy is at the complete discretion of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the certificate you earn for any KAA program is also at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the certificate that you earn at this institution is not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you may be required to repeat some or all your coursework at that institution. For this reason, you should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. This may include contacting an institution to which you seek to transfer after attending Kerala Ayurveda Academy to determine if your certificate will transfer." KAA has not entered into an articulation or transfer agreement with any other college or university. Transfer credit may be awarded for applicable coursework of comparable programs completed at other accredited or state approved/licensed institutions once verified by the Academy Manager and approved by the Director. Up to 70% of KAA's credit hours (250) may be transferred. Courses will be considered for transfer credit if relevant to the certificate program and completed with a grade of B or higher, or the equivalent if another grading system was used. Prerequisite and corequisite courses must meet the criteria set forth by KAA. Application and official transcripts must be submitted for all transfer credit approval. There is no credit given for any challenge examinations and achievement tests.

# **FAQ**

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

How much does the program cost?

- The tuition for the Panchakarma Technician Certification is \$3,950.00 for the General Public and \$3,850.00 for KAA Students & Alumni of our certification programs (not including registration fee). See Tuition & Fees for details.
- A college degree is not required, nor are prior licenses or certifications in any field for studying Panchakarma in this training program. KAA welcomes students from all educational backgrounds, without degrees, licenses or certifications in any field.

I'm not a healthcare professional. Can I still earn a certificate and practice Panchakarma?

- Yes.
- The primary prerequisite for the Panchakarma program is a passion for Ayurveda. A health or medical training background is not required. Students must also submit a high school diploma or equivalent prior to enrollment.
- The individual's scope of practice will be designated by local state guidelines. (See Scope of Practice for more details.)
- KAA welcomes students from all educational backgrounds, with degrees, licenses or certifications in any field.
- Ayurvedic studies are especially complimentary to Certified/Licensed Practitioners in health-related fields including Yoga, Yoga Therapy, Massage Therapy, Chiropractic, Nursing, Naturopathy and Allopathic Medicine, etc.

Is it legal to practice Ayurveda in all fifty states?

A bill has been passed in eleven states (California, Nevada, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Idaho, Louisiana, Rhode Island, Arizona, Maine, Colorado, and New Mexico) allowing the residents of those states to approach the non-licensed healing practitioners with informed consent.

Does each state regulate the practice of Ayurveda?

- No.
- Ayurvedic practitioners are not licensed in the United States, and its practice is not regulated by state or federal agencies. Standards of competency are set by individual schools that have received state approval. Ayurvedic practitioners in the United States are advised on how to practice legally within a limited scope of practice so they are not viewed as practicing medicine without a license.
- We might say that Ayurveda's status in the U.S. is analogous to the Chinese medical profession during its early years in the 1970s. While each state does not regulate the practice of Ayurvedic medicine itself, some aspects of Ayurvedic practice may fall within the scope of professions that are regulated. Students and graduates of the academy should be careful not to allow their practice to overlap one of those regulated professions unless they are licensed in that particular profession. Please contact your local state representative for more information about regulations in your area.

Can I practice Ayurveda outside of the state where I receive my certification?

- Yes. Please note:
  - Ayurveda is currently practiced all over the United States.
  - While none of the U.S. states currently have Ayurvedic practitioners or physicians as primary care physicians, many of these well-trained professionals utilize their education and skills in combination with other health care related credentials.
  - Yoga Instructors, Massage Therapists, Registered Nurses, Nutritionists/Dietitians, Acupuncturists, Chiropractors, Medical Doctors and other health care professionals are recognizing and utilizing the benefits of educational training in Ayurveda.
  - NAMA (National Ayurvedic Medical Association) and AAC (Ayurvedic Accreditation Commission) are currently working on developing educational standards, scope of practice, and related materials to support future licensing initiatives throughout the US.
- Many Academy graduates use their Ayurvedic education to enhance pre-existing professional careers.

Do I need a "license to touch" to practice Panchakarma, and what exactly is it?

Possibly, depending on your location and how you wish to practice. A license to touch refers to regulations for professions which involve physical contact with clients. These regulations are governed by each individual state in the U.S. Panchakarma involves a variety of bodywork therapies, some of which involve physical contact and some which do not. It is important for the student to check in with local state guidelines to understand

which aspects of Panchakarma are compliant and which are not, and either adjust one's practice accordingly, or pursue the required licensure.

Is there an alumni association? Can I contact previous students?

 Yes, we can provide you with the contact information of several students for you to talk to.

Are there tests? I feel anxious about taking tests.

Please try not to feel anxious about the tests. The testing is conducted online, and the student is provided three (3) attempts at taking the test. This highest score is recorded. Please note you cannot retake the test after passing. The tests are for you (and us) to know what you have learned and what you didn't so we can keep you up to speed. We want to make sure our students understand all the Ayurvedic concepts clearly. Ayurveda is about human health, so clear understanding is vital.

I will be traveling from out of town to attend classes, is there housing assistance available?

- KAA does not have dormitories.
