TRAINING LEVELS, AAC, NAMA AND PROFESSIONAL MEMBERSHIP

Our programs build upon one another for cumulative learning so you can achieve the highest level of Ayurvedic education available in the US.

■ LEVEL I - Ayurvedic Health Counselor (AHC)

Prerequisite: High School Diploma or Equivalent • Corequisite: Anatomy & Physiology

The level I Ayurvedic Health Counselor program focuses on the fundamental principles of Ayurveda, Ayurvedic physiology and psychology, nutrition, Yoga, lifestyle and seasonal protocols for self-improvement or career enhancement, Ayurvedic herbology, an introduction to Panchakarma detoxification, as well as disease pathology and management. Upon graduation an AHC can determine and analyze body constitution, conduct Ayurvedic lifestyle consultations, and offer guidance on daily routines, Ayurvedic therapies and home remedies.

■ LEVEL II - Ayurvedic Practitioner (AP)

Prerequisite: Level I AHC • Corequisite: Anatomy & Physiology

After completing AHC, students are eligible for the level II Ayurvedic Practitioner program in which all the key clinical concepts are explored more deeply. Students learn the etiological factors contributing to the nature and structure of disease as well as management techniques.



Ayurvedic Accreditation Commission

Our Academy aligns with the Ayurvedic Accreditation Commission (AAC), the largest Ayurvedic organization in the US, to provide industry standards. We also encourage students to join the National Ayurvedic Medical Association (NAMA) to help support these goals as Ayurveda is not currently licensed as a medical practice in the US, and one of AAC and NAMA's goals is to make licensure possible.

NAMA membership by students and professionals is all optional. KAA opts into this alignment as we believe that standardization of the profession and licensure offers benefits to professionals as well as clients, making Ayurveda more accessible.



Ayurvedic Health Counselor (AHC)

600 HOUR TRAINING PROGRAM

The Ayurvedic Health Counselor (AHC) training program is based on the first goal of Ayurveda - Swasthasya Swasthya Rakshanam - to preserve the health of a healthy person. Students will gain the tools necessary to restore and preserve health and prevent disease. These tools include a comprehensive nutritional education (Ahara), daily routines and practices to maximize health (Vihar), as well as a clear understanding of the mind and thought processes (Vichara) and their relationship to well-being.

Upon successful completion of the AHC course you will be awarded an Ayurvedic Health Counselor Certificate.

Program Overview

SCOPE OF PRACTICE

With this certificate, students can counsel clients for wellness. This program does not lead to positions that would require licensing in this field, as there is no required licensing for Ayurveda at this time.

Ayurvedic Counselors can:

- Analyze mind-body constitution
- Complete health history intake
- Suggest dietary changes (explain Ayurvedic view about qualities and 6 tastes)
- Suggest daily routine changes (explain daily predominance of Doshas at different times)
- Suggest seasonal routine (explain seasonal predominance of Doshas)
- Suggest life cycle routine (explain life cycles and predominance of Doshas)
- Explain about Ayurvedic concepts (related to Prakriti, Vikriti, qualities, etc.)
- Explain the connection between Body and Mind and how diet and lifestyle, meditation, Pranayama can help prevent many emotional problems.
- Offer talks and write articles on various concepts on Ayurveda
- Offer basic oil therapies
- Offer cooking classes using Ayurvedic recipes along with techniques and tips to create Ayurvedically balanced meals
- Suggest common herbs and spices

Ayurvedic Counselors cannot:

- Diagnose diseases
- Treat diseases
- Prescribe treatments or medicines (including herbal medicines)
- Prescribe or perform Panchakarma (unless allowed in your scope of practice under other licensing)
- Perform pulse diagnosis

PREREQUISITES

- Students must submit a high school diploma or equivalent prior to enrollment.
- It's essential for Ayurvedic students in professional programs to have adequate knowledge of Anatomy and Physiology (A&P). As a condition of graduation from the AHC program, the equivalent of four (4) college-level A&P credits (60 hours) is required. (A&P credit completion is not required prior to enrollment, it may be taken as a corequisite alongside the AHC program). KAA offers an online partner A&P course, or you can provide documentation of A&P credit completion from an approved institution. Please visit our website to learn more about our partner course or to submit your documentation.



GENERAL FORMAT

WEEKEND INTENSIVES

KAA 101 | The Essence of Ayurveda (Tarka Sankhya and Sharir)

Begin your education with an introduction to the 5,000-year-old history and philosophy of Ayurveda. The three universal energies (*Doshas*) and five fundamental elements (*Mahabhutas*) are the starting point for any Ayurvedic student. This leads to an understanding of the 20 foundational qualities of life (*Gunas*), the key to health. The application of these guiding principles will also be covered as it relates to the concepts of physiological disposition (*Prakruti*), imbalance (*Vikruti*) and Dynamic Balance. Additional topics include:

- The fundamental tenets of an effective Ayurvedic health program
- The universe and humanity's place within it: An Ayurvedic View
- The cosmology of the soul
- Comprehensive introduction to basic Ayurvedic concepts: Doshas, Dhatus, Malas, Srotas

KAA 102 | Ayurvedic Physiology (Dosha Dhatu Mala Vigyan)

Ayurvedic Physiology is designed to describe the subtle energies and foundational structures of the human body. Ayurveda explains the formation and structure of the seven tissues of the body in detail. This course will cover the details of these seven tissues and offer a deeper look into how they work cohesively to form the structure and function of the human body. Additional topics include:

- The 15 subtle energies of the body (Subdoshas), their locations, qualities and importance in health
- Natural wastes and their functions
- The essence of life that is responsible for vigor and youthfulness (Ojas), as well as how it is regenerated and preserved



KAA 103 | Ayurvedic Psychology (Manasa Shastra)

Ayurvedic Psychology offers a fascinating look into the psychology of the human being from a cosmological and energetic perspective. This course will cover the three *Gunas* and how they are fundamental for understanding the mind and emotions. Additionally, the Ayurvedic study of how energy moves through the body is powerful and important to fully understand holistic human health. This course will cover the chakras and how to keep them healthy as well as the physical energy centers (*Marmas*) and their role in health and disease. Additional topics include:

- The psychological energies (subtle *Doshas*), their function, location and origin
- Kundalini energy and the mechanics of vital living
- The nature and aspects of the mind and how it functions and operates
- Meditation and Pranayama (breathing techniques)

KAA 104 | Ayurvedic Nutrition & Cooking (Ahara Vigyan)

Ayurvedic Nutrition & Cooking places an emphasis on foods that ground the soul, nourish the body and delight the senses. This is a fun course with in-person cooking demonstrations teaching how to prepare simple, nutritious and sensually gratifying meals. Ayurvedic cooking is aimed towards pleasing all five senses and experiencing all six tastes. This course will also review techniques for maximum nutrient absorption and explain how that relates to a balanced digestive system. Additional topics include:

- The mechanics of satiation and its relationship to the tastes and senses
- When, where, what and how to eat
- The definition of health
- Chaturvidha Ahara, Shatrasas, Ahara Vidhi Vishesha, and the Guna Karma of spices

KAA 105 | Ayurvedic Prevention Science (Swastha Vritta)

Ayurvedic Prevention Science provides a comprehensive blueprint for daily and seasonal living to maintain optimal health, year-round. This can be done by learning the ideal Ayurvedic daily routine (*Dinacharya*) to live a balanced life and maximize effectiveness of your efforts. Additional topics include:

- Seasonal routines to maintain health and prevent allergies and seasonal infections
- Ways to stay healthy year-round by supporting a strong immune system
- How a modification or change in your daily routine according to the season will impact your health

KAA 106 | Ayurveda and Yoga (Yoga Vigyan)

Ayurveda and Yoga will focus on understanding the principles of Yoga in connection with the Ayurvedic concepts. The course will begin with a detailed understanding of the eight limbs of Yoga and the koshas in connection with Yoga and Ayurveda. This course will also teach students how to customize each yoga practice based on the individual's constitution. Additional topics include:

- How Yoga and Ayurveda combined can create the foundation for a transformed experience of living
- Yoga and Ayurveda to deepen your spiritual practice
- Pranayama and meditation techniques



KAA 107 | Ayurvedic Herbology (Dravya Guna Shastra)

Ayurvedic Herbology marks the halfway point in your Ayurvedic Health Counselor education. This detailed class will introduce the concepts of herbal energetics and how to identify the healing properties of household herbs. There will be a comprehensive analysis of herbal characteristics such as taste, potency, post-digestive effect and what they mean for your health. Special emphasis will be placed on over twenty different Ayurvedic herbs such as Amla, Brahmi, Neem and Shatavari. Additional topics include:

- Herbs to boost the immune system, delay aging and improve the quality of life
- How to maximize the absorption of herbs and medicines
- Preparing and administering specialized herbs and herbal concoctions
- Popular formulations and recipes

KAA 108 | Introduction to Ayurvedic Bodywork (Panchakarma)

Introduction to Ayurvedic Bodywork will focus on hands-on techniques to promote cellular healing and regeneration. This course will cover simple body therapies that have an anti-aging effect, improve digestive absorption, calm the mind and improve sleep. Additional topics include:

- Daily therapies to promote healing and wellness
- Treatments to improve skin tone and luster while also soothing the nervous system
- A hands-on introduction to Snehana, Swedana, Shirodhara, Padabhayanga, Shiroabhyanga, Kati Basti, Lepas, Udvartana and Soundarya Shringar

KAA 109 | Assessment of Dosha Imbalances (Roga Nidan)

Assessment of Dosha Imbalances will describe how diseases form and progress, how an individual can spring from health to imbalances. This course will cover simple ways to identify warning signs long before they become full-blown symptoms. Additional topics include:

- The Ayurvedic energies and structures (Dosha, Dhatu, Mala) and their role in the disease process
- How to analyze the various systems and structures of the body and identify potential warning signs: tongue, pulse and mala diagnosis
- In-depth examination of case studies

KAA 110 | Management of Dosha Imbalances (Kaya Chikitsa)

Management of Dosha Imbalances will describe how to address various imbalances and how to prevent their progression. This course will introduce the unique etiopathogenesis that Ayurveda uses to explain energies and structures (*Dosha, Dhatu, Mala*) and their role in various etiopathogenesis. The evolution of diseases through various Dosha stages reaching the final degenerative phase. Additional topics include:

- Simple ways to identify warning signs and methods of arresting the disease progression.
- Tools and techniques including simple herbal treatments and dietary & lifestyle changes to restore and maintain equilibrium
- Various methodologies involved in Palliative (Shamana) and Purification (Shodhana) treatments

KAA 111 | Review, Clinical Management

Review and Clinical Management will take a final look at the prior ten months in a summarized review and investigate Ayurveda's application in modern times. Students will be guided on how



to build and sustain clinical practice and how the science of Ayurveda applies to the business model. The highlights of the class are consultation demonstrations and practice for the students.

AHC PRACTICAL (COINCIDES WITH KAA 111)

This 5-day Practical (including weekend module KAA 111) reviews the process from client intake through final recommendations. It offers many practice sessions with live case consultations, and exploration of the practical ways in which this training can be implemented.

The AHC Practical is Required in person attendance for All Students.

1-DAY CLINICAL PRACTICUM

A small group practical setup provides the opportunity to practice clinical techniques with supervised guidance, honing counseling skills utilizing all the tools learned thus far.

Live streamed and recorded for later viewing.

TUESDAY VIRTUAL CLASSES

Tuesday Virtual Classes are offered live approximately 2-3 times per month, covering topics in alignment with the upcoming or recent Weekend Intensive. Class recordings of the first two sessions of our *Ashtanga Hridayam* online series (offered live twice per year) are included in the Online Recorded Lectures to provide students with a rich learning experience straight from the Vedic texts. *Ashtanga Hridayam* is one of the most used root texts of Ayurveda today. Composed in a beautiful poetic format called *Sutras* for easy memorization by practitioners, each line of the text is filled with practical information. Students learn the text line-by-line, how to chant the Sanskrit and understand the deeper meaning behind the principles.



ASSIGNMENTS

To support your development as an Ayurvedic Health Counselor, assignments are included in the AHC program which build upon each module of learning, and each another.

Personal Transformation Journey

Healing begins right at home for the healer. When we learn to work with Ayurveda to bring healing to our own lives, we can ground our knowledge in first-hand experience and better support others in doing the same. This assignment involves a self-assessment and experiential process of implementing the Ayurvedic principles and practices learned in class.

Ayurvedic Constitution Assessments

Each student will conduct in person one-on-one constitution assessments with ten (10) people utilizing intake forms provided by KAA to practice skills in client interactions, assessment and documentation. This assignment is completed during the HAC portion of your program.

Clinical Consultations

Students will follow two (2) *Rogis* (clients) throughout the program until KAA 111, beginning with consultations and progressing with assessment and creating guidance based on the topics covered in each month. This offers the student the ability to build upon all the learning to create a case study approach.

Chikitsa Protocols

Students will be provided five (5) case papers for review and development of a comprehensive Ayurvedic chikitsa protocol to demonstrate the cumulative skills learned in case evaluations from the previous two assignments.

Community Health Presentation OR Research Paper

Students have the choice of a Community Health Presentation or Research Paper.

Community Health Presentation Description

Students will prepare a 1-1.5-hour presentation for a group in the community on an approved topic of student's choice. The Ayurvedic Practitioner (AP) program is based on the second goal of Ayurveda—Aaturasya Vikara Prashamanam (disease management). At this level, the emphasis is on gaining a deeper understanding of the disease process and management techniques at its various stages. Students will gain a deeper understanding of Ayurvedic concepts and techniques.

Upon successful completion of the AP Program, you will be awarded an Ayurvedic **Practitioner Certificate.**

Program Overview

SCOPE OF PRACTICE

With this certificate, students gain the skills and knowledge to assess the Ayurvedic constitution and imbalances in a client and suggest food, lifestyle changes and recommend Ayurvedic herbs, spices and Ayurvedic herbal supplements based on the Samprapti/imbalances. However, the practice of these may vary from state to state. Please check the regulations with the state in which you practice. This program does not lead to positions that would require licensing in this field, as there is no required licensing for Ayurveda at this time.

Ayurvedic Practitioners can:

- Analyze Body Constitution
- Complete health history intake
- Assess the imbalances of Agni, Dosha, and Strotases based on the Ayurvedic Principles
- Suggest food and lifestyle changes based on the Ayurvedic Constitution (Prakriti) and various imbalances in the mind/body systems (Vikriti)
- Suggest Ayurvedic herbs, spices and Ayurvedic herbal supplements based on the Ayurvedic Constitution (*Prakriti*) and various imbalances in the mind/body systems (*Vikriti*)
- Suggest Ayurvedic bodywork techniques based on the Ayurvedic Constitution (Prakriti) and various imbalances in the mind/body systems (Vikriti)
- Explain about Ayurvedic concepts (related to Prakriti, Vikriti, qualities etc)
- Explain the connection between Body and Mind and how diet and lifestyle, meditation, Pranayama, Ayurvedic herbs, Ayurvedic bodywork techniques and Yoga can help manage many physical, mental and emotional problems
- Offer talks/write articles on various concepts on Ayurveda
- Offer simple Ayurvedic bodywork techniques based on the Ayurvedic Constitution (Prakriti) and various imbalances in the mind/body systems (Vikriti)
- Offer cooking classes giving simple cooking tips

- Treat diseases medically
- Prescribe medical treatments or medicines
- Perform Panchakarma (unless allowed in your scope of practice under other licensing)

WEEKEND INTENSIVES

KAA 201 | Advanced Anatomy, Physiology & Basic Principles (Dosha Dhatu Mala Vigyan)

Includes an in-depth discussion of the *Doshas, Subdoshas, Dhatus, Malas, and Agni*. Greater emphasis is placed on the *Srotas, Kalas and Marmas*. This course also includes a deep exploration of the basic principles directly from the scriptures such as the *Soothrasthana* of *Ashtanga Hridayam*. Additional topics include:

- An overview of embryology
- The relationship between the Panchabhutas and the Gunas
- An introduction to the fascinating world of Marma Sareera, seats of Prana in the body

KAA 202 | Pathophysiology & Ayurvedic Diagnostic Methods (Advanced *Nidan & Rogi Pariksha*)

Includes a detailed exploration of the five stages of disease identification: *Nidan, Purvaroop, Roopa, Upashaya, and Samprapti.* This course also looks at the six stages of the disease process: *Sanchaya, Prakopa, Prasara, Sthanasamshraya, Vyakti and Bheda.* Students will gain an



understanding of the signs of *Dhatu* and *Srota Dushti*. Students will delve deeply into Ayurvedic client examination methods. Topics include:

- An understanding of the stages from health to disease
- Threefold client examination (Darshana, Sparshana, and Prashana)
- Eight-fold clinical evaluation (Pulse, Tongue, Voice, Physical Stature, Vision, Skin, Urine, and Bowel)

KAA 203 | Advanced Herbology & Ayurvedic Pharmaceutics (Dravya Guna & Bhaishajya Kalpana)

Expands upon the principles of Ayurvedic herbal energetics, actions, uses and preparations with over thirty additional herbs. Learn the preparation of popular Ayurvedic formulations and their clinical application, times of administration and Anupanas, measurements and dosage of Ayurvedic herbs and formulations. Topics include:

- Preparation of Formulations: Decoctions, Herbal Oils, Ghees, Pastes, Poultices, Pills, Powders & Jams
- An understanding of how an herb's Gunas affect the body
- Traditional preparation of buttermilk & ghee from milk

KAA 204 | Advanced Bodywork, Detoxification & Rasayana (Panchakarma & Rasayana)

Advanced Bodywork, Detoxification and *Rasayana* is a hands-on course. A detailed theory of Panchakarma will be covered, including the *Poorvakarma* (Preparation), *Pradhanakarma* (Main Procedure) and *Paschatkarma* (Post-Procedural Convalescence). The preparatory procedures, including various types of *Snehana* & *Swedana* therapies, will be explained. This course also covers the five Ayurvedic Detoxification procedures. The post Panchakarma convalescence, such as specific food and lifestyle modifications, is also a part of this course. Topics include:

- Snehana & Swedana Therapies Abhyanga, Choornasweda, Patrapotala Sweda,
 Njavarakizhi, Pizhichil, Udwartanam, Kateevasthy, Nethratharpanam, Lepam, Pichu

KAA 205 | Kayachikitsa I: Management of Digestive System & Metabolic Disorders

The course will cover Ayurvedic etiology, pathogenesis, symptoms, signs, and detailed herbal treatments, as well as dietary and lifestyle changes, for several digestive and metabolic disorders.



KAA 206 | Kayachikitsa II: Management of Nervous & Musculoskeletal System Disorders

This course will cover Ayurvedic etiology, pathogenesis, symptoms, signs, detailed herbal treatments and dietary and lifestyle changes for several nervous systems and musculoskeletal disorders. This course also covers fracture management and bandages.

KAA 207 | Kayachikitsa III: Management of Respiratory & Cardiovascular System Disorders

This course covers Ayurvedic etiology, pathogenesis, symptoms, signs, detailed herbal treatments and dietary and lifestyle changes for several respiratory, circulatory and cardiac disorders.

KAA 208 | Kayachikitsa IV: Management of Skin, Special Senses & Excretory System

This course covers Ayurvedic etiology, pathogenesis, symptoms, signs, detailed herbal treatments and dietary and lifestyle changes for several skin disorders, diseases of sense organs and excretory system disorders.

KAA 209 | Kayachikitsa V: Management of Male and Female Reproductive System Disorders and Pediatrics

This course covers the Ayurvedic etiology, pathogenesis, symptoms, signs, detailed herbal treatments and dietary and lifestyle changes for several female and male reproductive system disorders. This course also covers a general outline of childcare and management of pediatric conditions as well as pre and postnatal care.

KAA 210 | Kayachikitsa VI: Management of Mental Health Imbalances

This session covers the etiology, disease process, prevention and management of various disorders affecting the mind. Included are concepts of mind in Ayurveda, relationship of Dosha, Trigunas and Panchamahabhutas with Mind, Concepts of Satwavajaya and Daivavyapasraya chikitsa in healing imbalances of mind, Ayurvedic herbs useful in Various Psychological Diseases.

Vedic Formulations: Clinical Applications

One of the important skills of an Ayurvedic Practitioner is the ability to select the right herbs and formulations for an individual's constitution and imbalances. In these recordings, you will learn the most used and effective Vedic formulations as documented in the classical texts. The class will cover multiple formulations and single herbs. Students receive an overview of the formulation, contents of the formulations, method of preparation, specific indications, dosage forms, and appropriate adjuvants. Part one of this series is included as a recording and quiz in your AP Program in your elearning platform.

Ashtanga Hridayam

The Ashtanga Hridayam, the "Heart or Essence of all the Eight Branches of Ayurveda," is one of the primary ancient root texts of Ayurveda. Today, the Ashtanga Hridayam continues to serve as a root source for Ayurvedic philosophy and protocol, providing clear guidelines in all aspects of health.

As an Ayurveda student, it is important to use the authentic teachings of the ancient Vedic texts. As part of your AP training, the recordings of Parts 3-9 of our Ashtanga Hridayam series are included.

MONTHLY REVIEW SESSIONS

These sessions are held after the weekend intensive modules to review the content covered in the previous intensive class. There will be time for review, questions, and discussions on the class content.

AP Clinical Internship

Kerala Ayurveda Academy offers regularly scheduled AP Clinical Internship training opportunities at our US and India locations. Students may design a format based on their location interest. Internships are also open to students and alumni from other institutions, as well as KAA alumni who seek additional clinical training. AP students may commence their AP Clinical Internship training midway through the AP program and are required to complete 135 hours in person total for graduation.

NOTE: AP Clinical Internship training tuition is separate from course tuition. See Tuition and Payment Plans for more information.

PREREQUISITE

US CLINICAL INTERNSHIP

The US AP Clinical Internship is conducted as week-long, 45-hour segments at Kerala Ayurveda Academy & Wellness Center, Milpitas, CA. Grading and Graduation Requirements

Grading

- Grading is based on a cumulative pass/fail mark from the following course components:
 - Assignments Assignments are reviewed on a pass/fail basis and are submitted via the elearning platform. Project and assignment grades are posted within 10 days of submission.
 - Tests a minimum grade of 70% is required to pass. Tests are multiple choice, self-paced and conducted via elearning. There are 9 tests which correspond to the weekend intensive modules. Refunds will be issued within 30 days of the date of student notification, or date of school determination (withdrawn due to absences or other criteria as specified in the school catalog), or in the case of a student not returning from an authorized Leave of Absence (LOA), within 30 days of the date the student was scheduled to return from the LOA and did not return.

State of Washington (For Students not living in California)

Five-Day Cancellation: An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within five days (excluding Saturday, Sunday and federal and state holidays) of signing an enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all tuition paid. If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or third party, the refund shall be sent to the lender or third party.

Tuition Owed: If the student has completed more than 60 percent of the period of attendance, the student will be responsible for the full tuition cost for the period of attendance.

In case the student decides to withdraw during the program, before the 60% of the classes are over, the following will be the refund calculation:

Refunds will be issued within 30 days of the date of student notification, or date of school determination (withdrawn due to absences or other criteria as specified in the school catalog), or in the case of a student not returning from an authorized Leave of Absence (LOA), within 30 days of the date the student was scheduled to return from the LOA and did not return.

State of Washington (For Students not living in California)

Five-Day Cancellation: An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within five days (excluding Saturday, Sunday and federal and state holidays) of signing an enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all tuition paid. No later than 30 days after receiving the notice of cancellation, the school shall provide a 100% refund of tuition and fees paid.

Other Cancellations: An applicant requesting cancellation more than five days after signing an enrollment agreement and making an initial payment, but prior to entering the school, is entitled to a refund of all monies paid *(minus the registration fee of \$100).*

Rejection: An applicant rejected by the school is entitled to a refund of all monies paid.

Refund Policy Defined - WA

AP REFUND AND CANCELLATION POLICY

The Student's Right to Cancel

The student has a right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund. A written notice or an email from the student will be required for the cancellation and should be sent to the address below. For specifics related to your refund, refer to the refund tables according to your State.

Students must follow the following to withdraw/cancel from the institution:



- A written notice or an email will be required from the students about the cancellation.
- The registration fee and material fee are nonrefundable. The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. There will be no refund if the student decides to withdraw after 60% of the classes.
- Each in person Intensive covers the content of one online module. Refund Requests will be processed based on in person Intensives and online modules accessed (whichever is greater).
- A telephone call about cancellation or absenteeism for the classes will not be considered
 as true cancellation. In such cases, the student will not receive a refund for that period.
- The refund will be processed within 30 days from the day KAA receives the official written notice of cancellation from the student.
- The refund check will be mailed to the official address of the student. If the original payment is by credit card, the refund will be processed on the credit card.

Withdrawal Policies and Procedures

A Student may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment).

Refunds: The student will receive a pro rata refund if they have completed 60 percent or less of the educational program "period of attendance." A pro rata refund shall be no less than the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the educational program provided subtracted from the amount paid by the student, calculated as follows: (1) The amount owed equals the per module price (total institutional charge, divided by the number of modules in the program) multiplied by the number of modules the student attended, or was scheduled to attend, or accessed in the e learning, prior to withdrawal. The refund will be less the non-refundable registration fee (\$100.00) and within 30 days after the withdrawal is determined. If the student has completed more than 60 percent of the period of attendance of which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund. For determining a refund under this section, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution in writing to Student Support Services via email, hand delivery, or written notice mailed to 691 S. Milpitas Blvd Ste 206, Milpitas, CA 95035 of the student's intention to withdraw, or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences more than the maximum set forth by the institution; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the school. (See Termination and Dismissal Policy).
- Failure to return from a Sabbatical (LOA: Leave of Absence).

For determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance. For programs beyond the current "payment period," if a student withdraws prior to the next payment period, all charges collected for the next period will be refunded. If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or third party, the refund shall be sent to the lender or third party.

Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) FEE (NON-REFUNDABLE) – STATE OF CALIFORNIA

"The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tuition, and suffered an economic loss. Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is a California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition.

You are not eligible for protection from the STRF, and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program."

"It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. Questions regarding the STRF may be directed to the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, 1747 N. Market Blvd. Ste 225, Sacramento, CA 95834, (916) 574-8900 or (888) 370-7589.

To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss because of any of the following:



- The institution, a location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.
- You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120-day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120-day period before the program was discontinued.
- You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.
- The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.
- The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution more than tuition and other costs.
- You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.
- You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.

To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF. A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of non-collection may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4) year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law. However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number."

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Kerala Ayurveda Academy accepts a limited number of students for in person attendance in the live class at 691 S. Milpitas Ave #206, Milpitas, CA. Student attendance is limited to 45 individuals. The instructor to student ratio is 1:45.

Attendance is monitored both in person and during live streamed sessions.

Ayurvedic Health Counselor (AHC)

Students must attend a minimum of 40 hours in person. The Weekend intensive courses can be accomplished via live streaming attended in real time (live synchronous) or in person in Milpitas, CA.

Ayurvedic Practitioner (AP)

Out of 900 hours of the program, 180 hours are mandatory clinical Internship hours. Therefore, students must attend 135 hours of Clinical Internship in person and 45 hours of Online Clinical Internship (live streamed). From the remaining 720 hours, 120 hours must be completed either in person or live streaming in real time.

MAKE-UP AND RETAKE POLICY

If a student is absent from an in person or live streamed session, they may make it up at any KAA training location or via live streamed session, free of charge. If a student wishes to retake an inperson session, they may do so for a fee of \$50 per day. To plan for all make-up or retake sessions, please contact Student Support at support@keralaayurveda.us.



AHC Practical Retake Fee

All students who attended the AHC Practical online or in person and who wish to retake the Practical online or in person may attend a future Immersion, are responsible for a nonrefundable fee of \$160 per day.

LENGTH OF TIME FOR STUDENT TRAININGS

AHC Students are expected to complete within 1 year, however they can use a free 3-month extension to complete their program including the Anatomy & Physiology requirement. If additional time beyond these 3 months is needed, students can request an additional 3-month extension at \$100/month.

AP students have 18 months per published catalog to complete the coursework and assignments. There is a free 6-month Extension for students to complete the internships and/or Anatomy & Physiology corequisite, with no mentor assistance. If a student has not completed their program after the 18 months and 6-month extension, they will be dropped from the program.

(Note: If mentor assistance is needed after the 24-month duration, students must request private mentoring at \$50/hour from Student Support.)

STUDENT SABBATICAL (LEAVE OF ABSENCE)

If a student has circumstances that prevent them from continuing the program as originally planned, they may apply for a one-time Sabbatical. The Sabbatical will be requested by the student to the Student Support Office at support@keralaayurveda.us. The office will then send a form for the student to complete and sign. There is a \$50 fee to go on Sabbatical.

AHC

If a student has completed their full tuition payment or wants to take sabbatical and is paid up to date, they may take a sabbatical up to 6 months and then re-enroll in the next program, transferring their payment credit and attendance to the new class co-hort. (Note: During the sabbatical there is no access to their course materials or their mentor).

If a student does not return from their 6-month sabbatical, they will be dropped from the program. If they wish to return after being dropped, they will need to re-enroll in the program as a new student and complete their payment prior to the class start date.

Procedure: Students must contact Student Support Services for a Sabbatical Request form and pay a \$50 fee. Once the form has been submitted and approved, the student has up to 12 months from that date for their sabbatical.

AP

If a student has completed their full tuition payment or wants to take sabbatical and is paid up to date, they may take a sabbatical up to 1 year and then re-enroll in the next program, transferring their payment credit and attendance to the new class co-hort. (Note: During the sabbatical there is no access to their course materials or their mentor).



If a student does not return from their 1-year sabbatical, they will be dropped from the program. If they wish to return after being dropped, they will need to re-enroll in the program as a new student and complete their payment prior to the class start date.

Procedure: Students must contact Student Support Services for a Sabbatical Request form and pay the \$50 fee. Once the form has been submitted and approved, the student has up to 1 year from that date for their sabbatical.

For all programs:

To resume the program: Students must notify the school (Student Support Services at support@keralaayurveda.us or +1 (888) 257-6640, ext. 20) of their intention to resume classes and be in good academic and financial standing.

TERMINATION AND DISMISSAL POLICY

- If the course is terminated after the student begins classes, the Academy may retain a percentage of the total tuition as described in the Refund Policy.
- A student will be assessed for dismissal from the institution if the student has not attended any class for the first quarter of their program. They will be notified by email in their elearning system, and they will be contacted by a phone call followed up with an email, and subsequently dismissed after this attempt with no response.
- For a student who is on authorized Sabbatical, the withdrawal date is the date the student was scheduled to return from Leave and failed to do so.
- For nonpayment issues: verbal and written warnings will be sent from Student Support Services. After a minimum of 3 attempts within 3 months and no response from the student, the student will be immediately dismissed.

SUSPENSION (PROBATION) POLICY

There are disciplinary guidelines to provide an environment to learn and grow independently, which give students rights and responsibilities.

- Any behavior disruptive to other students or the smooth running of the class will not be allowed.
- Students will have to pay the tuition on time; this includes one-time fees and payment plans.
- Students must maintain a passing grade of 70%.

For behavioral issues: At first incidence, warning will be given. At the second incident, the student will be suspended for the entire weekend. A student will be readmitted after a suspended weekend. If the behavior persists, the student will be dismissed (terminated) from the program. When the conduct of the student threatens the other student's safety, KAA reserves the right to dismiss a student immediately.

CONDUCT

At KAA, programs are directed toward professional training. The students shall show respect to others and observe correct standards of conduct. The Honor System embodies values of personal integrity, honesty, and trust.



Fundamental to the Honor System is the Honor Code of Responsibility, and it is upon its principles that the Academy has based the Standards of Conduct.

Honor Code of Responsibility

- Each member is responsible for maintaining a high level of civility, integrity, honesty, and trust within the community.
- Each student is responsible for presenting work of her/his own creation and refraining from representing as her/his own work that which is not hers/his.
- Conduct in keeping with the attendance policies.

Nothing in the policy prevents the student from contacting the Washington Workforce Board at 360-709-4600 at any time with a concern or complaint.

FINANCIAL AID

Kerala Ayurveda Academy does not offer state or federal financial aid to students. If a student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

If a student is eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and the student defaults on the loan, both of the following may occur:

- The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may act against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
- The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government assistance until the loan is repaid.

STUDENT COMPLAINT (GRIEVANCE) PROCEDURE

Students have the right to submit grievances to resolve disputes concerning issues considered by a student policy. This process is important for ensuring fairness and accountability within educational institutions, as it gives students a mechanism to address concerns and seek resolution when they feel their rights or privileges have been adversely affected. By establishing clear procedures for handling grievances, schools can promote transparency and uphold standards of justice within their community. Here is a breakdown of the steps:

Step One: Attempt to Resolve the Grievance through an Informal Grievance Process

Informal Resolution: This step encourages students to address their concerns directly with the faculty, staff, or administrator involved. If this doesn't lead to a satisfactory resolution, they can escalate the issue to the lead or Student Support.

Step Two: Submit a Formal Grievance

Formal Grievance: If the informal process does not help to resolve the issue, the student can submit a formal grievance. This must be done in writing, within a specified timeframe mentioned below, and must outline the steps taken during the informal process, the alleged policy violation, the person(s) involved, and the requested resolution.



The formal grievance must:

- Be submitted in writing within thirty calendar days of the decision, action, or events giving rise to the grievance.
- Describe the steps taken to remedy the situation through the informal grievance process.
- State how the decision or action is unfair and harmful to the grievant and list the policy that has been violated, if known.
- Name the person(s) against whom the grievance is filed.
- State the requested resolution.

Step Three: Investigation and Resolution

Investigation and Resolution: The designated authority will investigate the grievance and communicate the outcome to the student within a specified timeframe. This step ensures transparency and accountability in resolving the grievance.

Final Appeal of Student Grievance

Final Appeal: If the student is not satisfied with the resolution provided, they have the option to file a final appeal within 14 days. During this period, any claims or disciplinary actions are placed on hold until the issue has reached resolution and is implemented. The designee will review the appeal and communicate the final decision within a specified timeframe; this decision is considered final. This process ensures a fair and timely resolution to the grievance.



TRANSFERRING OF CREDITS & CREDENTIALS

"NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS EARNED AT OUR INSTITUTION.

The transferability of credits you earn at Kerala Ayurveda Academy is at the complete discretion of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the certificate you earn in the educational program is also at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the certificate that you earn at this institution is not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you may be required to repeat some or all your coursework at that institution. For this reason, you should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. KAA has not entered into an articulation or transfer agreement with any other college or university.

Transfer credit may be awarded for applicable coursework of comparable programs completed at other accredited or state approved/licensed institutions once verified by the Academy Manager and approved by the Director. Up to 70% of credit hours for KAA may be transferred. Courses will be considered for transfer credit if relevant to the certificate program and completed with a grade of B or higher, or the equivalent if another grading system was used. Prerequisite and corequisite courses must meet the criteria set forth by KAA. Application and official transcripts must be submitted for all transfer credit approval.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How much does the program cost?

The tuition for each program is as follows:

- Ayurvedic Health Counselor (AHC): \$8,950
- Ayurvedic Practitioner (AP): \$12,950 + the tuition for the AP Clinical Internship. See the AP Clinical Internship section for tuition rates.
- Note: tuition does not include registration and management fees. See Tuition and Fees for each program for details.

Are the programs approved by the Ayurvedic Accreditation Commission (AAC), and how do I get my NAMA membership?

• The AHC and AP programs meet program competencies set forth by AAC. We are also a recognized program with AAC and for eligibility to take the NAMACB exam as a Level I – Ayurvedic Health Counselor or Level II – Ayurvedic Practitioner, students must complete the attendance requirements. Completion of KAA's programs does not guarantee NAMA professional membership. Upon passing the Board Exam, individuals may apply for NAMA professional membership. For more information, please contact NAMA directly.

Do I need a college degree or a prior license/certification to study Ayurveda?

- No.
- KAA welcomes students from all educational backgrounds, with degrees, licenses or certifications in any field.
- Ayurvedic studies are especially complimentary to Certified/Licensed Practitioners in health-related fields including Yoga, Yoga Therapy, Massage Therapy, Chiropractic, Nursing, Naturopathy and Allopathic Medicine, etc.



I'm not a healthcare professional. Can I still earn a certificate and practice Ayurvedic medicine?

- Yes! The minimum admissions requirement for our Ayurvedic Trainings is a high school diploma or equivalent.
- For AHC and AP applicants only Basic Anatomy and Physiology credits are also required. If you have not taken Anatomy and Physiology, Kerala Ayurveda offers an Anatomy and Physiology course. Inquire with Student Services for more information.

Does each state regulate the practice of Ayurvedic sciences?

- No.
- Ayurvedic practitioners are not licensed in the United States, and its practice is not regulated by state or federal agencies. Standards of competency are set by individual schools that have received state approval. Ayurvedic practitioners in the United States are advised on how to practice legally within a limited scope of practice so they are not viewed as practicing medicine without a license.
- We might say that Ayurveda's status in the US is analogous to the Chinese medical profession during its early years in the 1970s. While each state does not regulate the practice of Ayurvedic medicine itself, some aspects of Ayurvedic practice may spring within the scope of professions that are regulated. Students and graduates of the academy should be careful not to allow their practice to overlap one of those regulated professions unless they are licensed in that profession. Please contact your local state representative for more information about regulations in your area.

Is it legal to practice Ayurveda in all fifty states?

 A bill has been passed in eleven states (Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Louisiana, Maine, Minnesota, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Rhode Island) allowing the residents of those states to approach the non-licensed healing practitioners with informed consent.

Can I practice Ayurveda outside of the state where I receive my training?

- Yes, Ayurveda is currently practiced all over the United States.
- While none of the US states currently have Ayurvedic practitioners or physicians as primary care physicians, many of these well-trained professionals utilize their education and skills in combination with other health care related credentials. Yoga Instructors, Massage Therapists, Registered Nurses, Nutritionists/Dietitians, Acupuncturists, Chiropractors, Medical Doctors and other health care professionals are recognizing and utilizing the benefits of educational training in Ayurveda.
- The AAC is currently working on developing educational standards, scope of practice, and related materials to support future licensing initiatives throughout the US.
- Many Academy graduates use their Ayurvedic education to enhance pre-existing professional careers.

Is there an Ayurvedic association which links other practitioners and students together? Yes, there is the National Ayurvedic Medical Association (NAMA). Many states have their own state associations such as the California Association of Ayurvedic Medicine (CAAM).



Is there an alumni association? Can I contact previous students?

- Once enrolled in our programs, students are welcome to join our private Student and Alumni Facebook group for community discussion and networking.
- Upon request, KAA can provide contact information of students for networking or informational purposes. Many of our students and alumni are happy to talk to prospective students and share their experiences.
- KAA has an online database for alumni services and information to assist community interaction and promote alumni practices to the public.

How many of your graduates practice Ayurvedic medicine?

- All our graduates can practice Ayurveda in their everyday lives for personal health. An
 understanding of Ayurvedic principles enriches the quality of life in all aspects, not just
 physical well-being. The study of Ayurveda is truly a healing transformation during which
 students find a new level of emotional, mental and spiritual Life. Additionally, graduates
 often change career paths or discover novel ways to apply their new Ayurvedic
 knowledge to their existing profession.
- There are many ways our students utilize their Ayurvedic education. Some of our students launch a practice as Ayurvedic Coaches, Counselors or Practitioners.
- Many of our graduates incorporate Ayurvedic knowledge in their current practice as healers, such physicians, nurses, yoga teachers and massage therapists. Ayurveda complements all other healing modalities.

Are there tests? I feel anxious about taking tests.

Please try not to feel anxious about the tests. Monthly testing is conducted online in our elearning system at the student's pace. There are (5) attempts available for taking the test, and the highest score is recorded. The tests provide the student and the academy an opportunity to verify learning benchmarks are achieved for successful course progress.

What materials do I need to bring to class and what should I expect in the classroom?

Please bring a notebook and pen. If any textbooks are required for an individual session, you will be notified in advance. KAA provides all classroom facilities including any equipment used for panchakarma demonstrations and herbology preparation. Equipment used for these classes include computers, monitors, video projectors, microphones, cameras, massage tables, linens, hotplates, towel warmers, vessels and utensils for cooking, shirodhara stand and vessels, and all perishable and nonperishable provisions used. Classes are taught in traditional, clean, well-lit classroom settings with tables and chairs for your comfort. A kitchen and restrooms are nearby the classroom.

Are there books for the class?

Digital copies of our course manuals are included in the tuition for all programs and are available for download.

When can I visit the school? Do you have open houses or visitor events?

We allow our prospective students to sit in with the current class, so that they get a feel for the classroom setting and the topic. With a prior appointment, students are welcome to visit the academy and talk to the Academy Administrator. We are here to assist our students in any way we can.



What student services are provided?

Student mentoring is supported throughout the entire term of the program. On occasion, KAA posts job openings as they become available on group emails to students and alumni. KAA will do its best to help graduates to get into practice or a related career but there are no specific student services for career planning or job placement.
